March 5th Galveston Field Trip Trinity Episcopal Church & the Cradle

San Jacinto Chapter's March meeting is traditionally a field trip. The 2015 Field Trip will visit two historic buildings in Galveston, with lunch at Gaido's, the famous seafood restaurant on Seawall Blvd.



Trinity Episcopal Church was founded in 1841 by The Rev. Benjamin Easton. The gothic structure, completed in 1847, is one of the two oldest churches in Galveston, having survived numerous hurricanes, yellow-fever epidemics, fire and flood. The church is located at 22nd and Winnie Streets. We will have a one hour guided tour.



The **Cradle** is the "birthplace" of The Daughters of the Republic of Texas. The building was originally the law library of William Pitt Ballenger, father of co-founder Miss Betty Ballinger, where Miss Ballinger and her first cousin, Mrs. Hally Bryan Perry, formulated the idea for their new organization which would become The Daughters of the Republic of Texas. The Cradle is located at 2902 Avenue O ½, the corner of O ½ Street and 29th Street.

Thelma Maresh Scholarship 2015

The goal of the Thelma Maresh Scholarship Program is to recognize and award scholarships to graduating students in the Greater Metropolitan Area of Houston who are extraordinary leaders, outstanding scholars and responsible citizens. **Six scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 each will be awarded**. Awards will be presented on April 21, 2015, during the San Jacinto Day Commemorative Ceremony at the San Jacinto Monument, San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site.

Criteria for Selection

The scholarship committee will seek the most promising student leaders with potential for providing exceptional contributions to the college or university which he/she will attend and to the world at large. The selection will be based on:

- 1. leadership
- 2. scholarship
- 3. responsible citizenship

In addition to these criteria, the scholarship committee is interested in the applicant's educational and career plans, life philosophy, volunteerism, motivation and determination.

Eligibility

- 1. Must be a high school senior who will graduate before June 30 of the current school year.
- 2. Must be qualified, upon graduation, to enroll at an accredited four-year college or university.
- 3. Must be a citizen of the United States.
- 4. Must have a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.0.
- 5. Must exemplify achievement, leadership, and college and career potential.

Application Procedures

- 1. Complete the application form with a photograph attached and **return on or before March 13, 2015,** to: Mrs.Luanne Zacek, 6521 Patricia Lane, Katy, Texas 77493.
- 2. Provide official high school transcript(s) and copy of SAT/ACT Test Results. Test Results may be on your transcript or a copy of your scores from the test center. Transcript(s) should show final grades for all courses taken from 9th grade to most recently completed semester in high school. Unofficial transcripts are not acceptable. Official transcripts are mailed from the registrar's office to us.
- 3. Provide 2 letters of recommendation: one recommendation of academic and one of nonacademic, supporting academic achievements, leadership skills, and college potential.
- 4. Submit a typed narrative supporting your life goals and experiences. See application instructions.
- 5. Scholarship recipients will be notified prior to April 14, 2015. If you would like to know if you are a recipient, you may email me at lzacek@hotmail.com after April 14, 2015.
- 6. The scholarship committee reserves the right to interview applicants as part of the application process.

Scholarship Award Checks will be issued beginning June 1, 2015, upon proof of registration at college or university. Your name must be on the printed proof by the university.

Lucy-Jane Watson Saks

Lucy-Jane Watson Saks, born on the 12th of December 1911, daughter of Dr. Jerre Watson and Myrtle Garrett and step daughter of Annie Harrison Watson, passed away peacefully in Houston, on Friday the 22nd of January 2015, at the age of 103, in the presence of her family. She was predeceased by her beloved husband,

Colonel Julien David Saks. She leaves her daughter, Judith-Ann Saks Rosenthal and her husband Haskell; grandson, Brian Julien Rosenthal and his wife Eugenie Lang Rosenthal; grandchildren, Lilian Jane Rosenthal and Charles Julien Rosenthal; sister, Rebecca Stubblefield and her husband Herman; and numerous nieces and nephews.

Lucy-Jane grew up in Anniston, Alabama, the oldest of six children. She earned a BA in English and a Masters in Education from the University of Alabama, where she was Rush Captain in Alpha Chi Omega, an ROTC Sponsor, eventually serving as Vice President of the Alabama Alumni Association, and was State Secretary of the Alabama Junior Music Club.

She had strong faith, and she credited her longevity to not worrying about things out of her control. She was fiercely independent and believed in good habits. She taught fourth grade, wrote the Crimson White and the Anniston Star, served as secretary of the Anniston Little Theater and on the Sisterhood Board of Congregation Beth Israel. She was involved in the Lady Washington Chapter of the DAR, the San Jacinto Chapter of DRT; and the Magna Carta Barons and Dames.

The funeral service was conducted at two o'clock, Sunday, January 25, in the Chapel of Congregation of Beth Israel, 5600 North Braeswood Boulevard, in Houston, where Senior Rabbi David A. Lyon is to officiate. At a later date the family will gather for a private interment at Houston National Cemetery.
